**Who could say: "My husband was happy when we had a son together"?**

One of the most famous royal figures in British history was King Henry VIII, probably because he had six wives! His first marriage, to Catherine of Aragon, was unhappy, and Henry wanted to divorce her. Since the ruling Catholic Church did not allow divorce, Henry established his own church, now known as the Church of England.

After the divorce, he married Anne Boleyn, who gave birth to a daughter, Elizabeth. It was believed that Henry was unhappy about this, as he wanted a son in order to continue his family name. After a while, Henry had Anne Boleyn executed for high treason, falsely accusing her of being unfaithful to him.

It is possible that the real reason for Henry having Anne Boleyn executed was that he had started to become interested in Jane Seymour, who became his third wife. Many people claim that Jane Seymour was the only wife that Henry truly loved, especially as she gave birth to a son, before unfortunately dying from illness at the age of 28.

After the death of Jane Seymour, Henry reluctantly entered into an arranged marriage with Anne of Cleves but was never happy with her. The pair separated amicably, and Henry paid Anne of Cleves a generous amount of money. Henry's fifth wife was Catherine Howard, who he married almost immediately after his separation from Anne of Cleves. However, Catherine Howard was widely believed to be in love with a servant and, upon this story becoming public, she was executed.

Henry's sixth wife, Catherine Parr, was his last wife and outlived him by one year. Catherine Parr herself had four husbands and, as her mother was a close friend of Catherine of Aragon, most believe that Henry's final wife was named after his first wife!
